

ETHIOPIA – NO POLITICAL SPEECHES ////



In March, Daniel Schott travelled for two weekends to Ethiopia, an impressive country with a very unique culture, language, and a different calendar. On the road trips countless donkey and horse carts were by passed, as well as Bajajs; those are small three-wheeled taxis. Herds of camels and myriads of acacia trees are also part of Ethiopia, as well as full truckloads of tomatoes, being unloaded on the market places for resale.

On the first weekend the group went to Maki. There Daniel preached a series of revival services in a local church. The number of visitors grew and the church became too small, so that the services had to be held in the front court of the church. The Lord worked signs and wonders. That was only to be a foretaste of what the team was about to experience the following weekend.



On Thursday the Gospel meetings began in Badessa, a small town in a rural area, with poor mobile coverage. The people gathered on a field which had been used previously for appearances of politicians. However, on this weekend something much stronger than political speeches was presented. The Gospel!

Daniel preached every night the good news, after very lively praise and worship times, and the number of visitors kept rising. People repented of their sins and decided to follow Jesus. Lukewarm Christians came back to the church, as was reported later. Many sick were healed, some of them even of long-time diseases. About 200 people were healed on Saturday alone. The joy was exuberant as the healed people shared their testimonies.



One of the healing miracles was especially impressive. During the prayer time Daniel prophesied about a woman who (like in the Bible) was bent over, and that God would straighten her up. That was exactly what happened. A woman came onto the stage to testify and confirmed that she had been the bent over woman. Now she was able to stand uprightly and she joyfully jumped up and down on the stage.



TRAINING AND REFRESHING ////

Cordial greetings from the land of ant hills, no not the ones we know in Germany, but ant hills made of clay and as high as a house. At the moment I am in Zambia and would like to let you know briefly, what happened here in Solwezi.

Even though the meetings were not big, I knew more than usualy that I was at the right place. Thursday through Saturday I had the privilege to serve, mostly three times a day. For the leadership conference pastors came from Zambia and Angola. It was quite impressive to see those leaders absorbing the Word of God with excitement, for hours. I was teaching on the topics of evangelism and leadership. It was a time of training and refreshing. We experienced repentance and joy. All of this took place in a poor, no rather shabby church building.

The leaders were incredibly grateful that I really did come to them and for all the things they were able to learn. Those leaders come from poor circumstances, but have a strong urge to preach the Gospel. They often spend days on the road, travelling by ox carts, bicycles, or on foot to the remotest areas in order to preach the Gospel to people living there. And they do so successfully. 100 churches have already been planted.

TWO DEPARTURES ////

Due to some misunderstanding long before the Gospel meeting, Evangelist Schott had to leave on Sunday afternoon already – packing, showering, good byes. He went with two brothers to the agreed the meeting point in a town, not far away, in order to take another vehicle and to start the long journey back to Addis Abeba. The bumpy road took them past the field, where the Gospel meeting was taking place daily. People were already streaming towards the field, but the Evangelist had to start his journey home. Painful – because on Sunday the number of people to attend the Gospel meeting would be the highest. Then it became very quiet in the vehicle. Read Daniel's impressions here:

With every meter we moved away from the field, I became increasingly sad. How could it be, that I had to leave, while the biggest crowd of people would attend on Sunday night. What have I done wrong? Why would that happen? I was stirred and it became very difficult for me to stay positive.

Soon the men reached the meeting place, but even after waiting, the arranged vehicle for the journey back would not come. Alternatives were evaluated. Then a report came from Badessa: The field is full! At that point things accelerated rapidly. Daniel decided to go back, even if that would mean that he would have to buy another ticket. The atmosphere changed immediately and sadness turned into fiery and persistent prayers on the way back.

The people in Badessa were glad that they would still get to hear the Evangelist from Germany. But not everyone shared the joy. Read Daniel's statement:

It was as if hell had broken loose. A spiritual war was raging. I went up and down in the room and prayed unceasingly. But the Lord would have the victory again, even this afternoon. As the interpreter came to pick me up, the dark clouds cleared. I was ready to preach the Gospel!

More than 40,000 people gathered on the field to hear the Gospel on that Sunday. Evangelist Schott preached about the fact that Jesus took the curses upon himself. That afternoon destinies were changed for eternity! Sins were forgiven and people were healed.

It was the right decision to return to the place of the event. The Gospel was preached. The Holy Spirit moved. Jesus was glorified!

As it turned out, there was still a possibility to reach the airport in time for the booked flight. The evangelist went directly from the stage into the van. The whole team had a trip of more than six hours ahead of them, including all the luggage and a goat on top of the roof of the vehicle. What a long and nerve-racking journey! As the van finally reached the airport, there was not much time left to say goodbye. Now it was time to run! Fortunately the aircraft could still be reached. Mission accomplished. Thank you Jesus!

IN THE STREAM OF THE SPIRIT IN ETHIOPIA ////

A Fire Conference took place in the church in Badessa, on Saturday. The spiritual hunger of the attendants could not be overlooked, many of them young people. Already during the worship there was a great openness for the work of the Holy Spirit. Daniel preached about the Holy Spirit and explained among other things that the Holy Spirit is like electricity. The electricity comes from the power plant into all the households, where it is used in various ways. Similarly, the same Holy Spirit works various spiritual gifts.

In the evening one of the worship leaders of the church shared about the dream he had the previous night. He dreamt about a power plant, and that Evangelist Schott had come to unlock it, so the electricity could flow.

UKRAINE – GOSPEL INSTEAD OF „PICNIC ON THE CEMETERY“ ////



In April Daniel Schott was preaching in Krivoy Rog again. After years of war, the Ukraine is emotionally torn. The soul of the country is traumatized and deeply wounded, by many years of suffering. The country has been through far too much suffering in the past and up to the present. The wounds are still deep, which became very apparent when the host pastor and Daniel visited the memorial of the Holodomor (killing by starvation) in Krivoy Rog. The memorial commemorates the inhumane starvation in the years 1932-33, which Stalin brought about intentionally in order to weaken the Ukrainian people. 3,5 - 14,5 million people (depending on the estimation) fell victim to hunger during that time.

Death was also the theme of the week. In Ukraine people still observe a pagan practice, celebrating the dead, ironically in the week after Easter. The Orthodox Church lost its early battle against the ancestor worship and eventually added the holiday to the church calendar. Most people of the city take along a picnic and go to the graveside of their dead. The visitors eat and drink there, and sometimes too much.

It was certainly no coincidence on God's calendar, that just on this weekend Evangelist Schott was to serve in the church Dom Hleba. The Gospel meeting was well organized and many church members were on the streets daily, inviting people and praying for them. More than 130 people gave their lives to Christ for the first time. The Lord worked impressive signs and wonders, as Evangelist Schott and other leaders prayed for the sick. Many people were healed and then testified about healing from high blood pressure, chronic headaches, joint pains, arthritis, back and

foot pains, and inflammation of the shoulder joint. Also spines, feet, and gastrointestinal tracts were healed.

Impairments of sight and hearing were either restored or improved. One of the sisters did not need a hearing aid any longer, and the noises in her ear also disappeared. For two of the visitors the crutches and the walking stick became unnecessary, after they received their healings.

Daniel ministered in the gift of the word of knowledge and a number of the visitors experienced healings of the hollow of the knee, hip joints, wrist joints, gastritis, and eye conditions. One sister even felt how her vertebrae were reset.

Pains disappeared from finger joints, hips, shoulder joints, wrist joints, spines, knees, hearts, and kidneys. Toothaches, headaches, sciatic pains, as well as numbness in hands, and symptoms of bronchitis vanished.

Other visitors experienced emotional healing, overcame chronic fatigue, or were able to fall asleep without taking any sleeping pills. These and more miracles happened and demonstrated the wonderful healing power of God!

Even on that particular Sunday, when most people go to the cemetery to celebrate their dead, surprisingly many people came to the Gospel meeting. Daniel preached the living Word of God and the visitors decided to surrender their lives to Jesus – not to death. The Gospel is the power of God and whoever believes has crossed over from death to life.
